


### **April Showers**











### **Moo Game**




**Mosaic Butterfly** Tear various colors of tissue paper into squares. Then, glue them onto this paper to make a beautiful spring butterfly!






**Colorful Xylophone** Using different colors of cardstock, print out this template and cut out the rectangles. Give each child one of each size rectangle, each in a differrent color.










